Pet First Aid is the immediate care given to a pet that has been injured or suddenly take ill. This includes home care and when necessary veterinary help. Knowing the skills and techniques of pet first aid can mean the difference between life and death; temporary and permanent disability; and expensive veterinarian bills and reasonable home care. It is estimated that 1-out-of-4 more pets could be saved if just one basic skill or technique was applied before receiving veterinary care.

Together with our Partners we are *"Improving the Quality of Pets' Lives, One Pet Parent, at a Time.*™″ Our message, as always, will highlight the importance of learning the necessary skills of CPR, first aid and care for our four-legged, furry, family members.



This year our Pet First Aid Awareness Month Campaign will include Pet Tech® CPR Day (April 28, 2018). The goal is to increase awareness of Pet CPR and First Aid and increase our family of pet parents and pet care professionals to ultimately Prevent 1 Million Pet ER Visits! We will also be calling out for more Instructors to take care of the demand.


We will actually be setting 2 world records, one for the most people trained in Pet CPR in one day and one for the longest continuous Pet CPR Relay. Each record has a set of guidelines that we have to meet or exceed. For the most people trained in one day there is a minimum of 250 to set the record. Pet CPR Day will be about 6 hours long and we will move people through the training process. Attendees will watch a video and then move to one of the ten skill stations. At each Skill Station we will will have one of our Instructors and one assistant to moderate and teach the CPR skill and confirm their participation and completion of the skill. We will have a separate station for kids and one for attendees with special needs.

The CPR Relay record will begin about an hour into the event to ensure that we have trained and qualified participants to take their turn. Each participant will do about one minute of CPR and then within five seconds the next person will relay into position. This will be in a prominent location at the event so attendees can participate, watch, and build excitement.

The event will be held on Saturday, April 28th starting at 8:30 am (approximately 5 to 6 hours) at the Town & Country Hotel & Conference Center in Mission Valley San Diego. The agenda will include a "Kick-Off" by the Pet Safety Guy™, then we will start the world record events, and conclude with give aways and closing statements, including a ceremony presenting the world record certificate of achievement from Guiness. Attendees will be pre-assigned a time slot or will be grouped on a first come first served basis. Once the attendees have participated in the records and been documented, they can explore the vendor tables, participate in the activities, enjoy refreshments until closing ceremony.



Million Internet Petizen Campaign



Our Million Internet Petizen Campaign (MIPC) is an ongoing movement to reach and educate 1 million pet parents to prevent 1 million Pet ER visits. According to the State of Pet Health® 2016 Report, disease prevalence is constantly changing and there are several key conditions that are increasing in prevalence and negatively affecting the health of our pet population.

Similarly, there are a handful of common diseases that are decreasing in prevalence, indicating pet parents

are doing a better job of being their pets' advocate and partnering with their veterinarian on proactive disease management.

Unfortunately, diabetes continues to grow in prevalence among dogs. Canine diabetes has increased by 79.7 percent since 2006, while in felines, the prevalence of diabetes has increased 18.1 percent over the same time frame.

Heartworm continues to be one of the top three health risks for dogs. However due to preventive compliance there has been a 33.1% decrease in cases, a step in the right direction.

The most common disease in dogs and cats continues to be dental disease, affecting 68 percent of cats and 76 percent of dogs. It has increased by 8 percent in dogs and 9.6 percent in cats since 2011. The number of dental cleanings have increased most likely due to training and education to help pet parents understand the importance of proper pet dental health.

The Million Internet Petizen Campaign consists of products and services that will help pet parents better care for their pets. It centers around education and training.

Pet First Aid Awareness Month events and promotions can attract new clients into your business and educate current clients about pet health care procedures and trends. Your participation is limited only by your imagination. We have listed some suggestions, however we are open to your ideas and suggestions. Our goal is to increase the awareness of Pet CPR, First Aid & Care Training. Pet Parents want and need to learn this information. If you are looking for some inspiration refer to "Event Suggestions" for some ideas for different types of events. Choose one that fits with the amount of time, energy and resources you are able to dedicate. Thank you for your participation in our international campaign!

Event Advice

Planning and starting early are some of the keys to the success of an event. Be sure to send press releases to maximize exposure. Have fun and remember to capture the event with videos and photos. The following pointers will help you start to plan your events.

- Select your event and/or level of participation and notify Pet Tech[®] by phone or e-mail.
- Encourage employee participation and send out news releases announcing your company's participation.
- Choose helpers carefully and make it clear to them the kind of commitment which will be required.
- Determine any internal contests, prize awards, and set deadlines and guidelines.
- Official approval may be necessary for events using public highways and you may need approval of the local police.
- When children and/or pets are involved, great care must be taken to ensure safety.
- Adult supervisors must accompany children.
- Provision for a first-aid station, as well as water and refreshments for people and pets are recommended.
- Large events require planned parking and should be arranged and coordinated with local police. The police will provide traffic control but may charge for this service.
- Join forces with local humane societies, shelters, dog clubs, dog parks and more.
 Donate a portion of the event's proceeds to the selected group. Organizations can also help you coordinate and offer volunteers.
- Contact local businesses or organizations to cosponsor the event.
- Liability insurance may be necessary for events in a public venue (i.e. city parks, community centers, business parks, etc.).
- Booking a venue, be it a hall or playing field for an event may incur a charge. Event organizers should ensure that they have arranged funding before they commit themselves to a booking.
- The event organizer is responsible for fees incurred. You can collect donations or recruit sponsors to help pay for any costs. As the organizer, you must ensure that all funds are distributed appropriately.

Event Suggestions

The following are some ideas and basic guidelines on how to organize a successful events.

Contact Local Car Dealership: Many car dealerships are dog friendly. They also schedule events throughout the year for current customers and to attract new customers. You can suggest an event or participate in one they already have scheduled. Topics could include Safe Travels With Your Pets. You could explain how pets should be secured in the car and special equipment that is available now for pets in vehicles.

Contact Local Banks: Many banks are dog friendly. They sometimes handout treats for pets. You could ask them to hand out a flyer or the Pet First Aid Awareness Month Info Graphic. This would peak interest for your pet business.

FREE Seminars/Workshops: Invite pet owners to a "Pet Talk" or "Yappy Hour." Use Pet Tech topics and promote an understanding of the health care and safety needs of our pets. Contact local schools and offer to present the educational topics. Listed below are some suggested educational topics. You can also enlist Thom Somes, The Pet Safety Guy[™] as a guest speaker (based on availability) to present topics like:

- Seasonal Dangers
- Knowing Your Pet's Health
- Top 6 Pet First Aid Situations
- Putting Together Pet First Aid Kits
- Hiking & Walking With Your Dog

Pet CPR & First Aid Class: Host a Pet Tech Pet CPR First Aid & Care class. If you are not a Pet Tech Instructor, you can work together with an Instructor in your area and schedule a class for your clients. It also makes a "purr-fect" fund raiser. Pet Parades/Pet Fashion Show/Pet Walk: Work with groups in your community (i.e. Humane Society, Animal Shelter, 4H clubs, breed or agility clubs, girl and boy scouts, Elks/Moose, etc.) to organize a parade, fashion show or pet walk for the members and their pets. Serve a few refreshments and sell tickets for a raffle where local businesses donate prizes. Monies collected would be given to the group or charity of your choice. You could also invite a local speaker to do a small presentation (i.e. Pet Tech Instructor can offer the Snout-To-Tail[™] Wellness Assessment, Obedience Trainer could offer suggestions for dealing with aggressive dogs, puppy training tips and more).

Open House: Invite pet parents to tour your veterinarian office or emergency care center or pet business. Explain the services, procedures and products that are available for pets today.

Pet Event: Sponsor a dog wash, pet adoption, dog blood drive, or other fund raiser. Contact your local animal shelter, humane society or pet organization and work together to make this event successful. Proceeds can be donated to animal shelters, adoption, pet therapy or any pet organization of your choice.

Pet Parties: Invite your friends, neighbors, co-workers over for a Pet Party. You can gather together just to have fun or you can make it educational, a fundraiser, a celebration or a combination. Invite a guest speaker to talk about pet first aid, nutrition, traveling with pets, or other pet related topics. Many of the shelters are in need of specific items (i.e. blankets, towels, food, etc.). You can have all your guests bring an item and then donate to the shelter.

Poster/Essay/Photo Contest: Sponsor a contest for local children in the community based on a related theme i.e. "The Significance to My Pet's Name," "The Funniest Thing My Pet Does!" Collect entries, post in your business location. Ask local community figure heads (i.e. teachers, principals, mayors, police chiefs, etc.) to be the judges for the contest. This can build good will in the community and provide your business with some good public relations. Award prizes for the top 3 winners. You can also do a cross promotion with other businesses and they can provide the prizes (i.e. local toy store, clothing store, bike shop, etc.).

Pet Display at Local Library or Book Store: Displays could include pet first aid kit contents, PetSaver Posters, Pet Tech App, and Pet Tech ICCE Bandanas.

Participation in Established Shows: If there is an established pet event going on in your area during Pet First Aid Awareness Month, you could get involved and promote our message.

Pet Picture Match Up: Do a contest, select 5 or 6 pet parents and their pet's photos. Collect separate photos of the pet parent and separate photos of their pets and ask people to match the pet with the pet parent. You can even do this on Facebook and people can submit their answers and you can give away a prize for the first one or three to send in the correct match ups. Pet Cookbook: Collect favorite recipes for pet treats and foods and post on Facebook with tips and hints about optimal nutrition.



It is estimated that 1-out-of-4 more pets could be saved if just one basic skill or technique was applied before receiving veterinary care.
